Year 2 Trip to the National Emergency Services Museum.

Dear Parents/Carers,

On Thursday **27TH November** Year 2 will be visiting the National Emergency Services Museum in Sheffield as part of their 'The Great Fire of London' topic in History.

As well as exploring the museum, the children will take part in a workshop where they will travel back in time to 1666 when King Charles II was on the throne and a huge fire ravaged London. They will learn how the Great Fire was extinguished, and the legacy it holds by handling real and replica objects, dress up as a soldier fighting the fire, and try some of the methods they used. This will be an exciting and interesting day for the children and will provide them with a hands-on experience to support their learning in school.

A voluntary contribution of £15.00 is payable via Parent Pay. Payment also acts as consent that you are happy for your child to attend. If we don't get sufficient contributions, we will be unable to run the visit.

The children should arrive at school at the normal time, and will return for the end of the school day as normal. **They should wear their full school uniform with comfortable shoes.**

They will also require a packed lunch including a drink (no cans of fizzy drinks and please remember that we are nut free and this includes Nutella). Any child who receives free school meals can be provided with a packed lunch if required. (Please request this from the school office by Wednesday 12th November).
