

Dear Parents and Carers.

To help us celebrate World Book Day next week we have some exciting events planned. **World Book Day tokens** will be sent out to all children this week to exchange for a book at participating shops.

On **Tuesday 3rd March** we are holding one of our **Reading Café** book breakfasts where you can come into school with your child, enjoy a lovely drink and some breakfast whilst sharing books together. It is always a lovely relaxed atmosphere so if you have been before or even if you have never tried it, please come and join us. A letter has been sent out for this to book via ParentPay.

On **World Book Day** itself, some classes are joining in with a special World Book Day drawalong or having a book themed quiz delivered in class by our Reading Ambassadors. All with prizes involved. **This is a non-uniform day and children can come dressed in sensible clothes that they are comfortable in ready to enjoy some fun and reading.**

We are delighted to repeat our **Booknic** from last year – a picnic with books! Or books and biscuits! If you are able to attend, then this will be a time when you can sit with your child in their class and explore some books and other reading materials together.

Reception and Key Stage 1- Thursday 5th March – from the start of the day until 9.15 a.m.

Please enter the school with your child at the start of the school day. If you have children in different classes in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 then you can divide this time between all children and an adult in school will take you from one class to another. When you leave school, the exit onto the KS1 playground and the exit near the Year 2 classrooms will be opened for you.

Key Stage 2- Thursday 5th March – from 2.45 until the end of the school day

The gate near the school office will be opened and you can enter your child's classroom through their external classroom doors. If you have children in different classes in Key Stage 2, then you can divide this time between all children and an adult in school will take you from one class to another.

We would love you to join us for this event to celebrate World Book Day but please be assured that if you cannot attend then your children will still enjoy taking part in the session with their classmates and teachers.
